# Green policies for Bush Hill Park



**Bush Hill Park** really does need three Councillors who are hard working and do everything they can to help residents with enquiries and problems. We also need Councillors who understand the green agenda and do their best to promote green policies.

That's why I'm standing as the Green Party candidate in the by-election on the 28th of July. I've been a resident in Bush Hill Park since 1998. I joined the Green Party in 2005 and have been involved in the work of the Bush Hill Park Residents' Association for over 2 years. I'm also involved in the Enfield Alliance Against the Cuts, the local United Nations Association and I run sessions in local schools on climate change.

I was a teacher and manager in a Further Education College in North London and have run my own small business. More recently I was Chair of Enfield Green party for 2 years. ## **Cut energy waste - create jobs**

The Council could help us save money and reduce emissions through a programme to ensure all homes and other buildings are energy efficient. Where needed loft and cavity wall insulation should be installed and renewable energy should be generated with solar panels and other devices. This is part of the Green Party's Green New Deal that will create much needed 'green collar' jobs.



## **Reclaim our streets**

The Council should help reverse the increasing dominance of the car by introducing 20mph speed limits on most roads in the ward and the Borough. We'd all benefit from quieter, more pleasant streets where neighbours can make friends and children are much safer. Pedestrians and cyclists would find life easier with less traffic and lower speeds. If you are hit by a car travelling at 40mph, and many do in some roads in the ward, you have a 9 out of 10 chance of being killed. In contrast if hit by a car doing 20mph you have a 1 in 10 chance of being killed. Which odds do you prefer?



## **Away - where's that?**

The way we deal with our mountains of waste is a big issue. While recycling is well established there is always a need for more of our waste to be separated and reused or recycled to avoid it going to either landfill or the incinerator. But we seem to forget the need to REDUCE. Our throw away culture, the unnecessary over-packaging of food and other goods and the strange idea there is some mythical place called AWAY where all our discarded stuff can go have got us into a real mess – literally. We need a campaign to REDUCE the amount we discard.



## **The NHS and Chase Farm**

Any move to privatise the NHS has to be resisted. The focus should be the proper care of patients. Big corporations with no aim other than the pursuit of profit should play no part in the provision of health care. We should also continue to insist on the retention of A&E and maternity facilities at Enfield Chase Hospital.



## **Let's pay a living wage**

I fully support the London Living Wage - currently £8.30 per hour - and would be happy to see future increases above the level of inflation. An increasing number of employers are supporting this policy and it goes some way to addressing poverty in London.



## **Eat more local food**

A healthy diet will include plenty of fresh vegetables. There is much scope for growing food in a wide range of places around the ward. Some residents will have back gardens which are 'surplus to requirements'. With encouragement from the Council these could be used to grow food which could get to the plate within hours and not have to travel from distant places.



## **No more empty homes**

There are a large number of people on the housing waiting list in Enfield while many homes remain empty. Empty homes can encourage vandalism. They may be a danger to kids who are tempted to enter them. Neglected over a long period of time they can become eyesores. This is not acceptable. Owners should be issued with an Empty Property Use Order which would bring the homes back into use.
